PROCEDURE OF ONLINE ADMISSION

1. Please carefully read the instructions provided in the prospectus.
2. Make sure you have electronic copies of the following documents:
 - a. Passport-sized photograph
 - b. Specimen of your signature
 - c. Matric and 10+2 certificates
 - d. Character certificate (issued by the head of the last attended institution, not older than 6 months; original certificate to be attached with the admission form). For gap cases, provide a character certificate from the Panchayat Pradhan/Gazetted Officer along with a self-declaration for the gap period.
 - e. Certificates for categories like SC/ST/PH/Sports/PwD/EWS/WFF/IRDP/BPL/Ward of Ex-serviceman/Cultural Certificates, if applicable.
 - f. Bonafide Certificate for Himachali girls/J&K students.
 - g. Photocopy of Aadhar Card.
 - h. Photocopy of bank account number.
 - i. Migration certificate for students who passed +2 from a board other than HPBOSE Dharamshala.
 - j. If applicable, provide a single girl child affidavit from the competent authority and a certificate confirming being a single girl child from the SDM/Tehsildar of the concerned area.
3. Visit the college website (www.govtcollegedehri.org) and access the provided link.
4. Register yourself and proceed to fill out the admission form.
5. Upload your photograph, signature, and the required documents (ensure original scanned documents are clear and visible).
6. After submitting the admission form, it will be reviewed by the concerned department. If any discrepancies are found, you will be notified to make necessary corrections and resubmit.
7. Once all required information and uploaded documents are verified to be correct, they will be reviewed by the concerned department.
8. Upon approval from the concerned department, the link for submitting the admission fee will be activated.
9. Submit your fee online through the provided link/payment gateway. Your roll number will be generated automatically.
10. First-year candidates must submit a hard copy/printout of the application form along with supporting documents and a copy of the fee receipt to the respective admission committee/department.

Note:

1. Any gap of one year or more in the academic record of an applicant must be accompanied by documentary evidence (self-declaration) demonstrating their activities during the gap period and a new character certificate from a Gazetted officer/Panchayat Pradhan. Providing false documents, self-declarations, or affidavits constitutes a legal offense.
2. PwD applicants seeking a fee concession must provide a status certificate from the Medical Board confirming their disability status.
3. Admission is reserved for students who have passed all subjects in their 10+2 exams from the National Open School (Delhi), subject to meeting the minimum eligibility criteria outlined above.
4. Applicants holding degrees from foreign universities/boards/colleges recognized by the Association of Indian Universities or Himachal Pradesh University are also eligible for admission.
5. Applicants must not exceed 23 years of age (25 years for girls) as of 01-07-2026, with their birth date not earlier than 01-07-2003. The upper age limit is extended to 26 years for SC and ST applicants. However, the Vice Chancellor of H.P.U. Shimla may grant a relaxation of up to six months for over-age applicants.

MIGRATION

Only students with genuine reasons will be considered for migration. Upon migration from another institution, the entire session's funds and tuition fees from the time of joining the College will be charged.

ELIGIBILITY

Candidates must have passed the Senior Secondary (+2) Examination (Academic Stream) conducted by H.P. Board of School Education or an equivalent examination recognized by H.P.U.

Note: Students with compartment status in their 10+2 exams are not eligible for UG 1st year admission. Admission to UG 1st year is based on merit (percentage of marks/grade obtained in 10+2 examination).

Choosing a Programme/Study Course: Starting from the academic session 2018-19, each student must select a Discipline Specific Course (DSC-I) or Core Course-I (CC-I), Core Course-II (CC-II), Ability Enhancement Compulsory Course (AECC), and Compulsory Course or Core Course-III (CC-III) as listed in the table. DSC/CC/Compulsory Courses/DSE/GEC carry six credits each, while AECC & SEC carry four credits each.

For a Degree with a Specific Subject/Faculty: Regular candidates must complete the prescribed course of study in a college affiliated with Himachal Pradesh University, Shimla, for a minimum of three academic years. Students starting from the session 2018-19 must accumulate a total of 132 credits over three years (44 credits each year).

Duration (Time Frame): The UG program for regular students spans a minimum of three years and a maximum of five years from the date of admission.

Continuous Comprehensive Assessment (CCA) and Evaluation

All courses follow an evaluation system with the following components:

- (i) Term End Examination: A three-hour exam covering the entire syllabus, accounting for 70% of the theory marks for Arts and Commerce (where practicals are not involved). For Science and subjects/courses with practicals, it accounts for 50% of theory marks, 20% of practical marks, and 30% of CCAA.

- (ii) Continuous Comprehensive Assessment (CCA): The CCA includes: a) 5 marks for attendance. b) 5 marks for a class test conducted upon completion of 40% of the syllabus. c) 10 marks for a house test conducted upon completion of 75% of the syllabus. d) 10 marks for assignments, tutorials, and general behavior.
- (iii) Classroom Attendance Incentive: Students with attendance greater than 75% receive CCA marks as follows:
75% -< 80% - 1 mark 80% - 85% - 2 marks 85%- 90% - 3 marks 90%-< 95% - 4 marks. 95% and more - 5 marks

Sports and Cultural Activities

For holistic student development, co-curricular activities are indispensable, complementing classroom learning by engaging the body, mind, and spirit. Our college offers a range of sports such as Badminton, Cricket, Volleyball, Weight-Lifting, and Table-Tennis, fostering physical prowess. CODE OF CONDUCT:

I. Attendance:

- (i) University exam eligibility requires a minimum 75% lecture attendance.
- (ii) Irregular attendance or continuous absence for 6 days leads to removal from college rolls. Three such instances result in permanent exclusion.
- (iii) Principal holds authority to expel/suspend students for indiscipline/illegal activities.
- (iv) Students causing damage to government property are liable.
- (v) Prior permission is necessary for recruitment or any off-campus activity.
- (vi) Use of mobile phones on college premises is strictly prohibited by H.P. Govt. directive.

II. Leave Rule:

- (i) Leave applications must be submitted through subject teachers promptly.
- Note: Students participating in Inter-College Competitions must schedule practice/rehearsal before or after classes, prioritizing academic commitments.

III. Library Cum-Identity Card (I-Card):

- Upon fee payment, students receive an I-Card from the College Librarian. It must be signed by the Principal within a week.

**EXTRACT OF HIMACHAL PRADESH EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS
(PROHIBITION OF RAGGING) ACT 2009**

2. (c) Ragging means any act, conduct or practice by which dominate power of senior students, former students or outsiders, is brought to bear on students freshly enrolled or students who are in any way considered junior by other students and includes individual of collective acts or practices which –

- (I) Involve physical or psychological assault or threat or use of force or wrongful confinement or restraint or
- (II) Violate the status, dignity and honour of such students or
- (III) Expose students to ridicule and contempt and affect their self esteem or
- (IV) Entail verbal abuse and aggression, indecent gestures and obscene behaviour.

3(i) No person shall practice ragging in any form, within or outside the premises of an educational institution.

(ii) Any person who contravenes the provision of subsection (1) shall, on conviction be punished with imprisonment for a term which may extend to 3 year or with fine which may extend to fifty thousand rupees or with both.

6. Every offence under this act shall be cognizable, non –bailable and compoundable with the permission of the court.

7.(i) Any student convicted of an offence under this act shall be expelled from the educational institution.

(ii) Student expelled under Sub – Section (i) or expelled otherwise on account of ragging shall not be admitted in any other educational institution for a period of three years from the date of order of such expulsion.

A WORD TO THE STUDENTS:

- Keep–Identity Card with you during college hours.
- Read the Notice Board daily.
- Don't bring outsiders to the college.
- Use of mobile phones and head/ear phones is strictly prohibited in college campus.
- Ragging is strictly prohibited.
- Number of seats in all the DSC for admission to first year of BA/B.Sc./B.Com. are fixed.
Hence the admission in the DSC is purely on merit basis.
- In UGC/CBCS, minimum marks to pass/qualify the courses is 45% both in theory and in practical if any.
- Minimum credits required to be accumulated for the award of the U.G. degree (pass Course) are 132.
